JUSTICE OF THE ARIZONA SUPREME COURT [IN "SECTION TWO - NON-PARTISAN BALLOT]:		
NO to BOLICK, CLINTNO to KING, KATHRYN H.Both of these Justices voted to enforce the 1864 law banning abortion and mandating prison sentences. Both were appointed by Governor Ducey, a Republican supporter of extremists; neither had been a judge. Both are members of the ultra-conservative Federalist Society.		
THE BALLOT MEASURES (PROPOSITIONS):		

NOTE that propositions, if passed, can only be changed by a statewide vote or a supermajority of the legislature. If you don't understand or don't agree with ALL parts of a measure, vote *NO* and work for change within the legislature.

- **139: YES** to the **"ARIZONA ABORTION ACCESS ACT"** An amendment to the AZ Constitution proposed by a Citizens' Initiative signed by more than 800,000 voters. Restores the fundamental right to safe and legal abortion that existed under Roe *v*. Wade, prevents the state's interference before fetal viability, and protects access after fetal viability for the patient's physical/mental health.
- ALL OTHERS: NO. The others are 11 Referenda by the Republican-controlled Legislature and one well-intentioned but dangerously flawed Citizens' Initiative (#140). One-third of current AZ legislators are "election deniers"; these Referenda aim at restricting voters' rights, politicizing the judiciary, and unbalancing the structure and workings of government. *See the next page for details*.
